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Student Nurse Drugs In Use

School nurses and other prevention agents have been working hard to help reverse the trend of youth using prescription drugs for nonmedical use. The data below indicates that although some progress has been made in reducing the nonmedical use of pain relievers among persons aged 12 or older, and the rate of current illicit drug use among youths aged 12-17 is lower in 2013; the overall rate of substance abuse is unacceptably high and prevention efforts need to increase.
